The many ministries of the Women of the ELCA are dependent entirely upon the generosity of women throughout our churches. The church wide constitution of the Women of the ELCA describes the following forms of offerings.

1. Regular Offerings: These are given whenever women meet, the backbone of our ministries together. A voluntary offering from each unit sent on FORM A to the synodical treasurer.

3. These are gifts made in gratitude for the blessings you receive. These offerings support the ongoing ministries of the church wide organization. A long standing tradition is that each women set aside gifts at home whenever the Spirit moves them to gratitude. 4. Designated Gifts: support particular ministries of the church wide organization. Examples are: Katies Fund, WELCA Scholarship, ELCA World Hunger, LWR Freight for Quilt shipping, Raising up Healthy Women and Girls, Anti-Racism. Every cent of your designated gift is used for the ministries you designate. Again use FORM B.



WELCA SYNOD ACTIVITIES

This was the first time we celebrated Bold Women's Sunday at St. Peter's, Loganville and it was wonderful.

We put together a power point and narration of the women in our congregation who were the "first" to do something. Some of these firsts included the Ladies Aid Society formed in 1910, the first women Sunday School teachers in 1928, Confirmation teachers, Parish Education members, council trustee and council president, first woman pastor, first woman to join the Armed Forces (1944), first bold women to attend a Triennial Convention, first woman janitor, secretary, organist and many more. A message was read from our first woman pastor, Tammy Craker, who is pastor of a church in South Dakota.



A bookmark was designed and handed out to women that day. We had women ushers, readers and young girls as acolytes. We made use of the Bold Women Litany from the web site. The hymn we sang was "All the Faithful Women", all 11 verses broken up into three parts during the service.

The highlight was an all women's choir. We dusted off the choir robes, sang and swayed to "We Will Follow Him" from Sister Act. We even received a standing ovation.

MISSION JUSTICE

What exactly is **Human Trafficking** and why should I care? This sounds like a poor person's problem, how does it affect me? These are just a few of the questions/comments I've received over the past year. Let me see if I can answer these for you. Human Trafficking is the 2nd largest crime in the state of Wisconsin, it follows the illegal drug trade. Sex exploitation, slave labor, debt bondage, child bride, child soldier and organ harvesting all fall under the description of Human Trafficking. Now you are probably wondering how does that affect me here in my own community, we don't have any of those problems? Well, guess what? You do. Wisconsin was listed as #2 in the Nation for human trafficking. Our State and Federal legislature have been working hard to put laws in place to protect our children, neighbors and those most vulnerable from this truly human crisis.

In Elkhorn this past January we held a major awareness event and we learned several things from the audience who attended. 1. We need to bring the awareness event to the schools. 2. What can we as a community do next? We know what is now we want to do something about it. 3. The SANE nurses asked if we could organize an awareness event similar to the one held in Elkhorn in Burlington.

If you have questions and want to know more about what is happening in our area please plan to attend. This is a free event that is sponsored by the Burlington Rotary Club. You will hear Theresa Flores share her story. Theresa is a survivor, advocate and author on Human Trafficking. Theresa was raised in an upper middle class family and was trafficking for 2 years when she was a teenager. Theresa has a very unique story that will surely touch your heart. We will also hear from a representative from Fight to End Exploitation from Racine. Come and find out what FEE with the help of the Racine Police Department, Racine County Sheriff's Department and the FBI are doing in SE Wisconsin. We will then have a panel of experts for a Q&A and what we can do in our own neighborhoods.

We will have an opportunity to do something. We have organized with Theresa Flores to host her S.O.A.P. Project outreach and you can help make this happen!



S.O.A.P.

The SOAP Project is specifically focused on educating and increasing awareness in the public on the prevalence of human trafficking, in order to restore trafficked survivors and to prevent teens from being victimized by domestic, minor, sex trafficking.

SOAP National travels all over the US to hold outreaches during large events. We partner with local organizations to distribute millions of bars of soap wrapped with a red band that gives the National Human Trafficking Hotline number - 1(888)373-7888 - and resources to high-risk motels.

Trained volunteers help us help us offer the soap free-of-charge to motels along with training to be able to identify and report sex trafficking when they see it in their establishments.

Women of the ELCA's purpose statement names us as women created in the image of God, called to discipleship. Women of the ELCA participants are active disciples in many ways. Women of the ELCA practice seven marks of discipleship: praying, studying, worshiping, inviting, encouraging, serving, and giving.

During the month of April, each of the South Central Wisconsin SWO's Conferences will be conducting their Spring Gatherings. Women need to be practicing Proverbs 31:25-31; being a woman of noble character.

Women across South Central Wisconsin:

- Need to be praying and embracing the strength and dignity that we find worshipping, giving and studying together.
- Need to be encouraging in their local units to show the strength and dignity that is spoken of in Proverbs to be called to discipleship.
- Need to be encouraging and praying for one another, so that women will feel the calling to serve as a Conference level officer.
- Need to be inviting to support and attend the Conference meeting held in your area. This meeting is not just for unit officers, it's for all women of each congregation to come together to serve, learn, and share.
- Need to be studying together; looking forward to the May GATHER Bible Study:

"It's easy to extend welcome to people who are similar to us, but how can we offer a welcome to all? At the heart of this year's intergenerational issue, this devotional will explore how we can open our groups and congregations to diverse newcomers." Using examples of biblical welcome and hospitality, pastor and author Julie A. Kanarr, who serves as pastor of Christ Lutheran Church in Belfair, Washington, will explore how we can define ourselves beyond ideas about age that can so often be damaging to women and encourage us to define ourselves as God does - through love."
