ALL CONGREGATIONS WHO HAVE OFFERED TO SERVE AS HOST SITES WILL BE NOTIFIED BY THURSDAY WITH CONFIRMATION THAT YOUR SITE HAS BEEN SELECTED. AN INFORMATIONAL MEETING WILL BE HELD VIA WEBINAR WITH DEACON VICKI HANRAHAN AND BISHOP ROGNESS IN THE NEAR FUTURE TO ASSURE YOUR COMFORT WITH YOUR ROLE.

In the meantime, information was emailed to all congregations today and one hard copy will be mailed to congregations on Wednesday.

Even if you were registered for the May 1 & 2 assembly, you will need to register for the new assembly. All prior registrations were cancelled and monies reimbursed. There will be a new fee of \$25 for early bird registration and \$30 after that day has passed that you will need to pay.

Please pay attention to the email from our office and to the hard copy mailing that you will receive this week. Many things will be different for this videoconference assembly. Not the least of which that we will gather at 12 distinct hosting locations with no more than 50 at each location. These are unprecedented times with new procedures and timelines to follow. Registration is now open. See your registration materials for details. More than ever, Campus Ministry needs your help.

GOVERNOR'S TASK FORCE ON CLIMATE CHANGE HEARING

JUNE 23 – 6:00 – 9:00 pm

Discussing climate change at this time in our history is not about piling upon us more depressing news, but finding a turning point.

Will the response to the recent murder of George Floyd that black leaders and their allies and those striving to become allies create a historic moment of change? Will we learn from the pandemic more about how interdependent we are to increase our love for our neighbor? Will we open our senses to the horizons that are appearing for the first time in years in several cities where pollution has otherwise blocked our vision?

Climate change also brings attention to inequities, both racial and economic. Within the United States, low-income communities in both urban and rural areas will be most quickly and profoundly impacted by climate change, according to the Fourth National Climate Assessment. Those communities already have higher rates of health issues. Environmental disasters caused by climate change will exacerbate existing inequalities. And, of course, eventually everyone will be impacted if we do not intervene with more of a plan now.

At this time in Wisconsin, we have a special opportunity to learn, offer input, and support amplifying valuable efforts with a statewide plan. The Governor's Task Force on Climate Change will hold its first public hearing on June 23. For our full LOPPW Press

The SCSW is sponsoring two Webinar orientation sessions on Holy Currencies with the Rev. Eric Law, founder, and director of the Kaleidoscope Institute. This was the information you would have received at the synod's LEAD conference so instead of waiting another year, we are bringing this opportunity to you now!

This first two sessions are free of charge. In order to participate we encourage you to register by July 8th (Please attend both sessions). Below you will find and overview of the course. Stewardship65 is an on-line curriculum that empowers local congregations to expand their vision of stewardship beyond money to include the currencies of relationship, truth, wellness, gracious leadership, time and place. In this uncertain time of the Covid-19 pandemic, it is even more important for our congregations to learn and explore how to maximize their stewardship movement to include these holy currencies moving from maintenance to mission, from scarcity to abundance and from fear to grace.

Overview of the course:

- The church team or individual begins the course by participating in an Orientation - two online training (July 22 and 29, please attend both).
- Participants from the Orientation may decide to take the full course by forming a team and signs up for additional six 1.5-hour webinars over the next period of time covering the six holy currencies. See tuition below.
- In between webinars, the church team completes homework assignments in order to deepen the understanding of each currency, including presenting 7 pledge cards covering different the holy currencies to the congregation.
- The church team creates a stewardship365 action plan incorporating learning, processes, and tools for the coming months or year.



EMANUEL 9 DAY OF REPENTANCE – June 17, 2020 (or the Sunday After)

In 2019, as a result of grassroots organizing, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly adopted a resolution to establish June 17 as “**Emanuel 9 Day of Repentance**,” commemorating the martyrdom of Pickney, Graham-Hurd, Jackson, Lance, Middleton-Doctor, Sanders, Simmons, Coleman-Singleton and Thompson. The resolution calls for worship resources and deepening conversations with the African Methodist Episcopal Church on matters of racism and white supremacy. It was adopted alongside another resolution condemning white supremacy and racist rhetoric, and in the context of the ELCA’s public apology articulated in the “Declaration of the ELCA to People of African Descent.”

The synod's racial equity team invites you to use the resources provided by the ELCA in creative ways to raise awareness and to commemorate this day on June 17 (or the weekend after), whether we worship in person or via electronic means.


Are you able to help us out with devotion or prayer for our synod weekly worship service?
