WELCA Dodgeville Spring Update Meeting

This is the in-kind collection of disposable baby diapers and female hygiene products that were brought to the Women of the ELCA Dodgeville Spring Update meeting. All of the items were delivered to the Southwest Wisconsin Community Action Program who has food pantries in Grant, Green, Iowa, Lafayette, and Richland Counties. Rev. Kate Kieckhafer from Grace Lutheran in Darlington provided an interactive Bible study from Isaiah 55. We took a look at The Lord's Banquet and what is be served up for all of us. This was a good way to get us started with Rebuilding and Rebooting our women's groups.



Mikayla Onken and Kendra Kaul of Family Advocates who have offices in Grant, Iowa, and Lafayette Counties talked about Human Trafficking. They provided handouts and hot line flyers and brochures for those in attendance to take back to their communities and post. Half of the offering collected, which amounted to \$255 was given to Family Advocates for the work they do with Human Trafficking as well as helping victims of domestic, sexual, child, and elder abuse.

Mikayla and Kendra also shared that **April 27, 2022 is Denim Day**. Denim is observed on the 4th Wednesday in April. Denim Day began more than twenty-one years ago, after the Italian Supreme Court overturned a rape conviction because the justices felt that since the victim was wearing tight jeans, she must have helped the person who raped her remove her jeans, implying consent. The following day, women in the Italian Parliament came to work wearing jeans in solidarity with the victim. Developed by Peace over Violence, the Denim Day campaign is observed worldwide by millions of people. As the long-est-running sexual violence prevention and education campaign, Denim Day asks people to wear jeans as a visible way to highlight misconceptions surrounding sexual violence.

When millions of people across the world will wear jeans for a purpose, support survivors, educate themselves and others about all forms of sexual violence.

COMMUNICATION

Through the eyes and thoughts of Lawanna Schieldt:

In 1992 the twelve-year war had ended in El Salvador. I was asked by than Pastor Tom Lee if I would be interested in going with other lay people and pastor/ministers of the South Central Synod of Wisconsin. I felt a calling to go and decided to answer that call. There were fifteen of us that took this trip.

While in El Salvador I had the opportunity to meet Reverend Santiago and his daughter Gloria. I am still in communication with those individuals.

One of the activities that I remember doing while we were there was a walking Bible Study. Reverend Santiago walked us through the valley and streams of El Salvador. We made stops along the way reading the Bible and doing discipleship to the people we met and seen along the way. When I read out of the Bible it made me feel that I was with Jesus. That I was a disciple reaching out sharing and spreading the word.

I made several return missions visits to El Salvador. During my second visit I went with Mary Kay Baum and her daughter. As part of this visit, we traveled from church to church doing discipleship. We took medication supplies to a doctor in the mountains. Our group met with Bishop Gomez of El Salvador.

As a result of these two trips, I had met a number of El Salvador folks and considered them my friends. I than began to organize and take groups nine different times. Activities these groups did while in El Salvador: painted the inside and outside of churches, digging wells, building fences, demonstrated/ showed how to keep yards clean, fed the community. The group helped financially with putting in septic systems for households.

The groups also helped to educate the El Salvador people how to plant corn. Corn is a staple in their diet. They use corn to make their flat bread. The bread is made daily.

During and after each trip I felt I was following Jesus' calling.

Unfortunately, at this time it is not safe for Americans to be traveling/doing mission work in El Salvador.

Men's Squircle at Our Savior's.

Does your congregation have an active men's group? A few years ago some of the men at Our Savior's in Sun Prairie were discussing the fact that the women met regularly in circle Bible study groups and through that had the opportunity to grow in their faith, to build strong fellowship and to support each other through life's journey. These men asked why let the women have all the fun?

On a Tuesday evening in January of 2019 the first meeting was held. All men were welcome. "It's a place where we can learn more about our faith and life together," commented one participant. At that first meeting they decided on a name for the group. "They didn't want to call it a Circle but "calling ourselves a Square didn't really sit well either, so it's a "Squircle"!, commented Pastor Seth Hecox.

The group met regularly once a month with a short Bible study at church followed by fellowship at one of the local establishments. It had a great start with 8-10 attending each Tuesday. Then Covid came on the scene.

Much like the women's circles, the men began meeting through Zoom. It was a new experience but it kept the Squircle going through the long shut down and quarantine periods. Steve Olson, one of the members of the group said, "It has been a great way to build community and support for the men that attend. We have a short study and then just talk about life and listen to one another."

The group has recently begun meeting in person once again.
