Thursday, November 3, 2022 from 7 to 8 p.m. via zoom - Little Hawk and the Lone Wolf: A Memoir by Raymond Kaquatosh. "Little Hawk" was born Raymond Kaquatosh in 1924 on Wisconsin's Menominee Reservation. The son of a medicine woman, Ray spent his Depression-era boyhood immersed in the beauty of the natural world and the traditions of his tribe and his family.

After his father's death, eight-year-old Ray was sent to an Indian boarding school in Keshena. There he experienced isolation and despair, but also comfort and kindness. Upon his return home, Ray remained a lonely boy in a full house until he met and befriended a lone timber wolf. The unusual bond they formed would last through both their lifetimes. As Ray grew into a young man, he left the reservation more frequently. Yet whenever he returned—from school and work, from service in the Marines, and finally from postwar Wausau with his future wife—the wolf waited. In this rare first-person narrative of a Menominee

Indian's coming of age, Raymond Kaquatosh shares a story that is wise and irreverent, often funny, and in the end, deeply moving.

for your Conference - Who is it? What do they do?

In our Synod a synodical board member is willing to be a **liaison to each conference** and will work with the conference leadership to develop the activities. In some SWOs, each conference leader (often called a coordinator) also serves as a liaison back to the synodical board and attends the synodical board meetings with voice, but no vote. This is an effective tool for involving more women in the synodical organization and its ministries.

Synodical Conference Activities

Women of this Synod belong to one of the nine synod conferences. The Conference that you are part of depends on where your church is located. On our WELCA Synod web page you will find a listing of all of the Conferences and which churches belong in that conference. The Synodical Board members have agreed to serve as a liaison to one of the conferences. Please refer to page 2 where the board members are listed and you will see who your liaison is.

Conferences are charged with working interdependently with the synodical women's organization (SWO) and the units to fulfill the purpose of Women of the ELCA through activities. Conferences are designed to be bridges. The activities that are to be carried out must meet five criteria, as established in the synodical constitution. The activities will:

- provide experiences for learning and leadership development,
- build community,
- provide opportunities for joint ministry and action,
- provide opportunities for stewardship education and offerings, and
- establish networks for communication.

Most conferences meet once a year in the spring. There are a few conferences that meet twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall of each year, moving the meeting location around the geographical area of the conference. The activity planned for that meeting would meet the criteria set forth above.

The displays of UPAVIM crafts for sale, Days for Girls kits, chocolate sampling from Equal Exchange, and Sugar Creek Bible Camp were enjoyed along with morning coffee and treats. Information about Women of the ELCA Gather Magazine and Trumpeter, 50th anniversary of women ordination, our partner and companion synods, and zoom book discussion in November were just some of the displays. Thank you to the Retreat Planning Committee of Lynn Mehringer, Peggy Schaub, Lawanna Schieldt, Helen Sheahan, and Tana Zeich.

Our main presentation by Tricia Clason and Ginger Shomberg introduced us to meditation and surrendering our challenges to God as we overcome obstacles in our lives. We can listen to where God is calling each of us. He will provide the support and courage to accomplish what he is calling you become. Trust the Lord. They shared examples of God's calling and support in their lives. Their presentation and workshop is recorded on our Facebook page.

After lunch women enjoyed 2 workshops chosen from 5 different topics for Mind, Body, and Spirit enrichment.

We especially thank Our Savior's women for their help with the Retreat in so many ways.

We learned about Our Savior's women's service project of Days for Girls, which helps girls and women around the world with menstrual health solutions, education, and supplies so they can continue their daily routines during menstruation, such as going to school and being out in public. In-kind gifts received were 122 wash-cloths, 187 panties and 9 yards of fabric ". The total money received was \$867 which will provide at least 86 kits, the lives of 86 girls or women will be changed! The Our Savior's women self-fund this service project. They are "so absolutely blown away and grateful to receive such a windfall and will put everything to good use".

Saturday, September 17, 2022 was another festive morning of truck loads and car loads and trailer loads of quilts and kits being stowed into a railroad boxcar in Madison for shipment to Lutheran World Relief in Baltimore, MD. Most, but not all, were coming from churches of the South Central Synod of the ELCA. (There are other Ingatherings all over Wisconsin and churches use the one most convenient for them. There are also many Missouri Synod churches using the Madison site.) But it is still interesting to compare year-to-year statistics. The quilt numbers are still down from pre-Covid years, but it is evident that Lutheran women are finding ways around those church-gathering restrictions and are not going to be prevented from fulfilling this MINISTRY OF LOVE!
