## RESOLUTION RE: THE WAR BETWEEN HAMAS AND ISRAEL

WHEREAS, Hamas militants horrifically stormed into Southern Israel on October 7, 2023 killing about 1,200 people, mostly civilians, and abducting about 250 others; and

WHEREAS, Israel has retaliated resulting in 100,000 people killed, injured or missing with the deaths continuing to increase. Two thirds of those killed are women and minors. Israeli Defense Forces have caused massive destruction to the infrastructure and the environment in Gaza, and has targeted places of worship, schools and hospitals, forcing nearly all of the 2.3 million residents to flee their homes. Civilians of Gaza are deprived of clean water, food, medicine and medical care, and other basic human needs; and

WHEREAS, the United States is Israel's greatest ally, continuing to supply Israel with military aid and weapons, without regard to whether the military resources are used in accordance with U.S. law, international humanitarian law and the law of armed conflict; and

WHEREAS, without a ceasefire between Israel and Gaza, the deaths of civilians, the suffering and disease from hunger, lack of clean water and medical care will continue to grow, and the likelihood of hostages being released will continue to diminish; and

WHEREAS, the International Court of Justice (NPR, January 26, 2024) has found it is plausible that Israel has committed acts that violate the Genocide Convention; and

WHEREAS, the ELCA Statement on Peacemaking professes that the biblical narrative reveals God's resolve for peace, and God's reign of peace was established through Jesus' death and resurrection and Jesus' followers are called to participate in God's reign as peacemakers; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that voting members of the 2024 Synod Assembly instruct Bishop Joy Mortensen-Wiebe to write a letter to Senators Tammy Baldwin and Ron Johnson and Congressional Representatives Bryan Steil, Derrick Van Orden, Mark Pocan, Glenn Grothman, and Scott Fitzgerald asking them to publicly support a ceasefire to prevent the further loss of life; prioritize the protection of all civilians, including securing the entrance of humanitarian aid into Gaza and working to secure the release of hostages; urge all parties in the conflict to fully respect international humanitarian law and require that all military aid to Israel be used in accordance with the U.S. law, international humanitarian law and the law of armed conflict; and be it further

RESOLVED, that congregations and members of the ELCA South Central Synod of Wisconsin be encouraged to contact their US Senators and Congress members to ask
them to publicly support a ceasefire to prevent further loss of life; prioritize the protection of all civilians by securing the entrance of humanitarian aid into Gaza and working to secure the release of hostages; urge all parties in the conflict to fully respect international humanitarian law and require that all military aid to Israel be used in accordance with U.S. law, international humanitarian law the law of armed conflict; and be it further

RESOLVED, congregations and members of the SCSW be encouraged to pray for a just and lasting peace for Israel and Palestine, to consider financially giving to the ELCA Disaster Response for the Middle East Crisis, and the Holy Land, and find and read resources that will inform them about the history and the current situation of Palestinians and Palestinian Christians.
